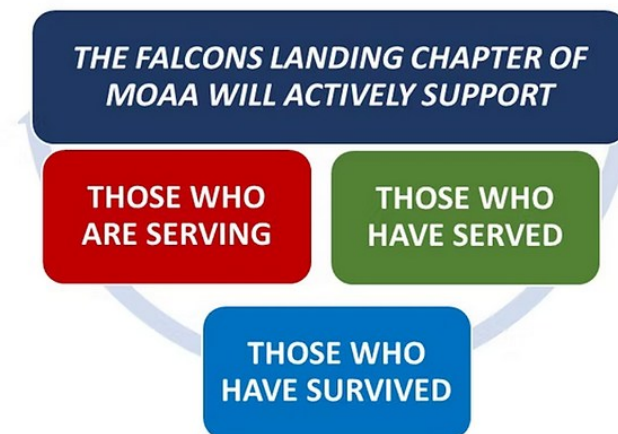

## CHAPTER PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE MARCH 2026

This is my first opportunity as your new president to reach out to all Chapter and Auxiliary members and their families. The first task I set for myself upon assuming my new responsibilities was to meet individually with each of the Chapter officers, directors and our webmaster. I did this so that I could understand their responsibilities and how they fulfilled them. These sessions collectively provided me with sufficient information and insights to evaluate how we are performing as a chapter. I came up with three observations. First, Phil Walsh is a tough act to follow. Second, this Chapter is doing an outstanding job of supporting MOAA Nationally and those service members and their spouses who are serving, who have served, and who have survived. Our immediate challenge is to continue to provide that same level of service if not more. Our Chapter's efforts have also been recognized by MOAA Nationally with two awards: their **5-star Level of Excellence Award** and they recognized the Chapter's website and newsletter with their **5-star Col. Marvin J. Harris Communications Award**.

My third observation builds upon a comment that Phil Walsh made in the last edition of *The Falcon Flyer*,  
*Perhaps Ken, in assuming our Chapter's leadership role this year, can find the spark  
to renew much needed enthusiasm in our general membership.*

I found Phil's comments to be valid. That comment begs the question why this is the case. It will take some work to get a definitive answer. However, it appears to me that we need to reexamine how we communicate with our general membership. We are providing the general membership with first-rate products that provide a wealth of information on how the Chapter fulfils its mission, i.e., The Falcon Flyer, Memorial Day Program, etc. The general membership responds very positively to events like the Memorial Day Program. However, last year only 24% of the members made donations to the Chapter, funds that we use to support veterans in need, etc. Turning to our website, it only had 91 visitors this quarter, less than half our membership, and of the 91% only 3% returned to the website. The average session was less than 3 minutes.

A challenge I plan to undertake this year is how the Chapter leadership can more effectively communicate with our members – a first step in getting them be more active in Chapter.

I hope to meet and talk to many of you at our next MOAA event. I am also interested in your ideas on how we can make the Chapter more productive.

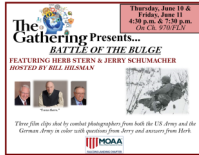

## 2026 FACT SHEET

**The Military Officers Association of America (MOAA)** is the nation's largest and most influential association of military officers. It is an independent, nonprofit, politically nonpartisan organization.

**The Falcons Landing Chapter (FLC)** is one of more than 400-plus local organizations affiliated with National MOAA and is a member of the Virginia Council of Chapters. The Chapter is located at Falcons Landing, a Life Plan Community which is operated by the Air Force Retired Officers Community (AFROC). It is the only MOAA Chapter in Loudoun County. The Chapter is also a member of the **Virginia Council of Chapters, MOAA**.

The mission of the Chapter is to provide programs to support: *those who are serving; those who have served; and those who have survived*, while placing special focus on community support.

Chapter membership is open to those who hold, or have ever held, a warrant or commission in any component of the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Space Force, Public Health Service, NOAA, and their surviving spouses. As of March 30, 2026, there were 117 Premium Members and 66 Auxiliary Chapter Members for a total of 183 Chapter Members.

The most significant, ongoing program for the Chapter is the multifaceted local support to veterans and their families. The Chapter established the **Loudoun Veterans and Family Support (LVFS)** program in partnership with Community Lutheran Church of Sterling, providing financial and general support to Loudoun County Veterans needing assistance.

The Chapter strongly supports the **Loudoun County Community Veterans Engagement Board (LCCVEB)**, whose purpose is promoting a healthy and enriched lifestyle for Loudoun County veterans and their family members through community outreach and advocacy on Loudoun County veterans' issues.

The Chapter sponsors the **Gathering**, a program of distinguished guest speakers for monthly presentations on current and past world and government affairs.

The Chapter has established a **Speakers' Bureau**. This initiative is in keeping with the chapter's goal of continuing to inform the American public about their military establishment. This program has been temporarily suspended until further notice.

Four times a year the Chapter supports the **AdoptaPlatoon Soldier Support Effort**<sup>®</sup> dedicated to quality of life and raising morale for those serving overseas in the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corp, serving deployed United States Service Men and Women by providing ongoing care packages to improve Coast Guard and Special Forces.

The Chapter supports three **Junior ROTC** units in our area of responsibility: the Air Force JROTC unit at Chantilly High School in Fairfax, the Navy JROTC unit at Loudoun County High School in Leesburg, and the Army JROTC unit at South Lakes High School in Reston. The Chapter President and Director of JROTC Programs present scholarships to selected cadets at each school. In addition, the Lieutenant General John Pustay Scholarship is awarded to a selected cadet at Chantilly High School.

**Memorial and Veterans Day Programs** are presented each year at Falcons Landing.

## ADVOCACY IN ACTION 2026



MOAA members from across the country will be on Capitol Hill **April 15** to advocate for key legislative priorities affecting servicemembers, veterans, and their families. If you can't attend in person, Falcons Landing Chapter members can still make an impact by engaging/contacting with your lawmakers as listed on the **Elected Officials** section (page 11) of this newsletter.

The four Legislative Issues for 2026 are as follows:

- **End the “Wounded Veteran Tax”** by passing the **Major Richard Star Act**, restoring full retirement pay to combat-injured veterans.
- **Protect Servicemember Pay During Shutdowns** through the **Shutdown Fairness Act**, ensuring uninterrupted pay during funding lapses.
- **Stop Predatory “Claim Sharks”** by supporting the **GUARD VA Benefits Act**, which protects veterans from unregulated claims agents.
- **Improve Access to Military Health Care** with the **Military CARE Act**, creating a standardized system to report and resolve access-to-care issues.

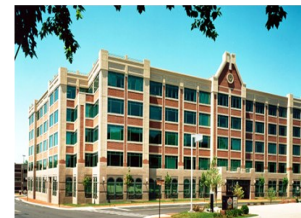

## THE GATHERING: ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE Parts I and II

Last issue, I wrote about the December 2025 Gathering, where resident Mark Carey tackled a timely and intriguing topic, “AI for the Real World.” In the days that followed, many attendees shared how much they enjoyed both the content and the hands-on format. The use of AI exploded at Falcons Landing with the creation of letters, poems, and graphics. The message was unmistakable: we needed “AI for the Real World – Part II.” That follow-up session took place on Thursday afternoon, January 29, 2026.

The second session opened with another engaging demonstration: two Christmas family letters, read by charming volunteers representing the Sterling family (Donna Everage) and the Bickerson family (Amy Manning). The Sterling letter felt clearly artificial. The wording didn’t sound natural – phrases most of us would never use. It was simply too polished. I suspected it had been generated almost entirely by AI. The second letter felt far more genuine. The language flowed naturally, more human, as the Bickerson family saga unfolded, describing sights, sounds, and smells. When the reading ended, Mark revealed to a surprised audience that both letters had been created by AI – the difference being in how you lead it. His Part II tip sheets were invaluable. My primary takeaway: Guide or limit AI so it polishes your message rather than replaces your voice. For most situations, he suggested a Personal Rule: 80% You / 20% AI. We are the Author; AI is the Editor who works for us. However, it seems the 80/20 rule works the opposite way in business communications, or what Mark called “Life Admin.” Use AI for 80% of the document (formatting, tone, structure) and use your input to fill in the rest. The idea is that You are the Director. You don’t need to write the script; you just need to give AI the orders.

We also learned about **C-P-R**, a new prompting technique: **Context** – *I am...* setting the scene, introducing the characters; **Purpose** – *I want...* **Response** – *Provide* the answer in this format... Whenever possible, I copy and paste my entire draft, so AI works within my full context, not just a snippet. Then I add constraints as needed. Whatever tools you choose, you’ll likely find them surprisingly forgiving.

Mark encouraged everyone to download Google Gemini and Microsoft Copilot. My wife and I also use ChatGPT.com to compare or assess a wide range of topics and, more recently, Quillbot.com for more serious writing projects. The bottom line from both sessions is simple: Verify what AI produces. Protect your privacy. Stay in charge. Used wisely, these tools won’t replace us – they’ll strengthen us. They can help us think more clearly, write more effectively, and perhaps even laugh a little along the way. And as Mark reminded us, when we remain firmly in charge, AI becomes not something to fear, but something to use well.
