FACT SHEET 2025

<u>The Military Officers Association of America</u> (MOAA) is the nation's largest and most influential association of military officers. It is an independent, nonprofit, politically nonpartisan organization.

The Falcons Landing Chapter (FLC) is one of more than 400-plus local organizations affiliated with National MOAA and is a member of the Virginia Council of Chapters. The Chapter is located at Falcons Landing, a Life Plan Community which is operated by the Air Force Retired Officers Community (AFROC). It is the only MOAA Chapter in Loudoun County. The Chapter is also a member of the Virginia Council of Chapters, MOAA

The mission of the Chapter is to provide programs to support: those who are serving; those who have served; and those who have survived, while placing special focus on community support.

Chapter membership is open to those who hold, or have ever held, a warrant or commission in any component of the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Space Force, Public Health Service, NOAA, and their surviving spouses.

As of June 30, 2025, there were 123 Premium Members and 68 Auxiliary Chapter Members for a total of 191 Chapter Members.

The most significant, ongoing program for the Chapter is the multifaceted local support to veterans and their families. The Chapter established the *Loudoun Veterans and Family Support (LVFS)* program in partnership with Community Lutheran Church of Sterling, providing financial and general support to Loudoun County Veterans needing assistance.

The Chapter strongly supports the <u>Loudoun County Community Veterans</u> <u>Engagement Board</u> (LCCVEB), whose purpose is promoting a healthy and enriched lifestyle for Loudoun County veterans and their family members through community outreach and advocacy on Loudoun County veterans' issues.

The Chapter sponsors the *Gathering*, a program of distinguished guest speakers for monthly presentations on current and past world and government affairs.

The Chapter has established a *Speakers' Bureau*. This initiative is in keeping with the chapter's goal of continuing to inform the American public about their military establishment. There are currently 16 topics and speakers available for presentation to the local community.

Four times a year the Chapter supports the *AdoptaPlatoon Soldier Support Effort*® dedicated to serving deployed United States Service Men and Women by providing ongoing care packages to improve quality of life and raising morale for those serving overseas in the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corp, Coast Guard and Special Forces.

The Chapter supports three *Junior ROTC* units in our area of responsibility: the Air Force JROTC unit at Chantilly High School in Fairfax, the Navy JROTC unit at Loudoun County High School in Leesburg, and the Army JROTC unit at South Lakes High School in Reston. The Chapter President and Director of JROTC Programs present scholarships to selected cadets at each school. In addition, the Lieutenant General John Pustay Scholarship is awarded to a selected cadet at Chantilly High School.

Memorial and Veterans Day Programs are presented each year at Falcons Landing.



THE GATHERING: THE STORY OF SPORTS SHOE DESIGNER AND GRAPHIC ARTIST PETER MOORE

The story of Peter Moore and his role with Nike and Air Jordan through graphic design of athletic shoes, and that role in changing the nature of sports equipment and marketing, made a fascinating story at the latest Gathering. Making all this even more interesting was the fact that he was the brother of our fellow resident Mary-lin Ryan (nee Moore). Her grandson, Peter Ryan, as presenter, also provided insights into the life of Peter Moore. Residents at the Gathering had the opportunity to meet our guests; learn something about the evolution of the sporting goods market through the work of Peter Moore; ask some questions on the life of Peter Moore; and of course, enjoy a Falcons cookie or two. Which is why, although TV viewing the presentation is ok, nothing beats being present in the ballroom audience with the key people.

Our presentation opened with an interview with Mary-lin talking about her Navy-oriented family from the WWII period and the birth of her brother, Peter Moore – the subject of our story. Peter Ryan described his great-uncle's life involving his work with the graphic design of athletic shoes. He was instrumental in their marketing through art graphics and posters as the sports world itself evolved and became more sophisticated and more engaged with the U.S. sports world's greatest figures. The changes encompassed both male and female, in all sports, and led to a revolution in sports

footwear from basic black and white to a world design of sports function, resulting in the color and style of today. Think Larry Bird, Wayne Gretsky, Michael Jordan, etc. (How many of you or your family members insisted on "Nikes" or "Air Jordans," to be like those sports figures, thanks to the creative work of Peter Moore?)

Beyond that, Peter Moore used his creative talents in reflecting society in the late 1980-1990 period in a series of "peace posters" that focused on major events like the "Twin Towers Bombing" and other major political events. In addition, he created and sent to friends annual Christmas cards illuminating his inner feelings on life. So, sports shoe designer falls far short of describing the life of Peter Moore, which is why you might try to capture the reprise of The Gathering on Channel 970. Plan to attend the next Gathering in the ballroom in person to be part of the scene. (Ben Romero has quite a few interesting programs lined up for you.)

From its website: The Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) is a bipartisan, nonprofit policy research organization dedicated to advancing practical ideas to address the world's greatest challenges. The institution was dedicated to the simple but urgent goal of finding ways for the United States to survive as a nation and prosper as a people.

Today, CSIS is one of the world's preeminent public policy institutions on foreign policy and national security issues. The Center's over 250 full-time staff and large network of affiliated scholars conduct research and analysis and develop policy initiatives that look to the future and anticipate change. CSIS is regularly called upon by Congress, the executive branch, the media, and others to explain the day's events and offer recommendations to improve U.S. strategy. The May presentation for the Gathering featured guest speaker Dr. J. Stephen Morrisson, a senior vice president at CSIS. In his lively discussion, Dr. Morrisson spoke about how major changes in U.S. leadership may impact on health security.

He reviewed the development of medical capabilities and medications in the 1990s in response to HIV

and the role at that time of the U.S. in the World Health Organization. He also discussed the development of COVID and possible sources, including the association with China. He described the role of CSIS in its focus on health from the perspective of national security and considering new threats to health from COVID in the period of 2019-2020. CSIS seeks to have responses in the critical early stages of development of disease.

A significant portion of his presentation highlighted the current changes and challenges in health care in the U.S., while we are entering a period of pressure on medical funding and support for medical research in the current administration. Dr. Morrisson went on to discuss the current situation of measles outbreak, which he pointed out is largely centered around communities that have anti-vaccine focus. He mentioned that our national vaccine rate has dropped from 95% to 92% but said that it is still sufficient for control of any outbreak. He also pointed out that Falcons Landing is very likely composed of vaccinated residents and that the vaccination covered the risk for life! He then went on to discus the new virus of bird flu which is NOT yet spread to humans.


VIRGINIA LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO MILITARY AND VETERANS 2025

- LEGISLATION HAS BEEN INTRODUCED IN THE STATE SENATE THAT WOULD REMOVE THE STATE'S \$40,000
 CAP ON MILITARY PAY EXEMPTION STARTING WITH THE 2026 TAX YEAR. MULTIPLE VERSIONS OF SIMILAR LEGISLATION HAVE BEEN INTRODUCED IN THE STATE HOUSE.
- A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO HB 1600 (THE STATE BUDGET BILL FOR FY 2025 AND 2026) WOULD CLASSIFY THE COMMISSIONED CORPS OF USPHS AND NOAA AS "UNIFORMED SERVICES" IN VIRGINIA CODE.
